Language Arts

We began Mary of Plymouth this week in class. At the beginning of the week they had an hour in class as the week progressed the time was a little shorter. The students will be reading Mary of Plymouth nightly. It's a free eBook online. Today, I began reading aloud to the students If You Lived in Colonial Times. The language isn't the quality as our other two texts, but it will help the students understand the way of life in the colonies. They will be taking quizzes daily on the part read aloud. The students will be using their textbook as well (Chapters 5-7 pages 184-280).

In Writer's Workshop, the students are working on their explorer report. I had parents help me this week. The class typed their first paragraph. They began drafting paragraph two. The rest will be unquided. We will review suffixes, verb tenses, synonyms & antonyms, & the different kinds of sentences, the differences between fragments, run-ons, & complete sentences.

We will finish our unit on factors and multiples along with prime and composite numbers. The assessment is scheduled for next Thursday, 6th. We will begin division on Friday. Remember it will be taught in partial quotient not the way you learned (long division). This assessment will be completed before Thanksgiving break. We are a little behind the county curriculum map in math. We have a huge unit on Fractions coming up. It will help your child understand fractions if they are able to help you bake in the kitchen.

We will take a quiz on the New England Colonies on 11/5 and an assessment on 11/7. The students have a study guide to help them prepare for the test & everything they need to know is in there text-book. The first unit will be Chapter 5 in the textbook on the New England Colonies. We will spend 2-3 weeks learning the material. If we learn the foundation then the Middle Colonies (Ch. 6) & the Southern Colonies (Ch. 7) will be a breeze.

Remember studying nightly for 10 minutes will help your child be successful on quizzes & assessments.

Science - TEST 11/7 or 11/10

We are learning about the Solar System. We talked about scientists using a telescope to view objects far away, listing the planets in order, facts about each planet, classifying the 8 planets as inner or outer planets, phases of the moon, ordering the stars in order by their temperature and magnitude, day & night 24 hrs., constellations, lots of vocabulary words: rotation, orbit, 365 ¼ days, revolves, axis, tilt, solar system, etc. See the science journal, workbook, or textbook. The students have nightly homework for a month - Moon phases. The unit on why we have seasons is next!
