Highlights of Our Week

Language Arts

The students will begin the final project next week for Mary of Plymouth that will count as an assessment grade.

**The next book we will be reading in class together is THE KEEPING ROOM. It will be great for each student to have their own book by January.

In class, I'll be reading aloud Katie's Trunk to support our social studies curriculum as our language arts common core unit of study. I have other books checked out from the media center that I'll read aloud too to support the SS curriculum for understanding.

In Writer's Workshop, the students are working on their explorer report. The class typed two more paragraphs this week. We will review suffixes, verb tenses, synonyms & antonyms, & the different kinds of sentences, the differences between fragments, run-ons, & complete sentences. I still need to teach articles, prepositions, & complex sentences.

Math

We will take the assessment on patterns & algebra on 12/8/14.
