Highlights of Our Week

Language Arts We will finish with <u>The</u> <u>Keeping Room</u> next week. Chapters 11 & 12 are the assessments. The students will have 4 essay questions to finish our common core unit of study for the 3rd quarter.

Poetry will be our next unit of study. There's a lot of vocabulary and figurative language with this unit.

In Writer's Workshop, Ms. Lambes reminded the students how important revising is in the writing process. We reviewed suffixes this week. Also, the students worked on using the RACE strategy and complex sentences. We will continue to review subjects & predicts, verb tenses, synonyms & antonyms, & the different kinds of sentences, the differences between fragments, run-ons, & complete sentences. I taught articles, & prepositions.

Math

We are learning about turning fractions into decimals. We will learn how to use a place value grid to record decimals & fractions to the tenths & hundredths. Also, we will compare and order decimals. We will move quickly through this unit. The hard unit on geometry will be next. It's important that the students learn the vocabulary words with the geometry unit. This must be taught by March 9th.
