Highlights of Our Week

Language Arts

We are well into Sing Down the Moon. The students will have a short quiz on Chapters 15-20 on Friday 9/19/14! We have had great discussions in class about the events in the book. Ask your child about the Long Knives, soldiers, and warriors. The students will be completing some assignments for grades or practice in class. We have learned new vocabulary words, context clues, theme or author's message, main idea, author's purpose, setting, predicting, steps in a process, comparing & contrasting. visualization, inference, and sequence of events. The students already have an emotional tie to the book. Please make sure your child has their book or device at school every day.

In Writer's Workshop, the students have researched on one of the Native American tribes they are learning about in Social Studies. We have learned about capitalization skills, subject & predicate, dialogue, and different kinds of sentences to use in our writing. We are working on similes.

Math

The addition & subtraction TEST will be coming 9/29/14. We spent 2 days in class working on a GA testlet together (problem solving). This will be a quick unit. Then, it's off to multiplication.

Please practice basic facts at home. Your child will be successful if they know

their multiplication facts. They will not learn traditional multiplication until 5th grade. We will teach partial product and block area. I have videos on my website that we will use in class from mathzillion.com. I know how we teach math today is so different then how you learned in school.
